Welcome to the 2009-10 Kenosha County 4-H Program

4-H is a youth organization that belongs to the members, their families, and other interested adults who serve as volunteer leaders. Professional leadership is given by Cooperative Extension of the University of Wisconsin. Support for 4-H programs is a joint effort of local government, the University of Wisconsin, and the United States Department of Agriculture.

In 4-H, young people share, grow, and learn together from various projects, events, and activities in informal situations under the guidance of their families and other volunteer adult leaders. Members can choose projects that fit them and the places where they live. Group activities and events such as trips, camps, fairs, shows, and conferences provide additional learning experiences and opportunities.

4-H is open to all youth and adults regardless of their ethnic background, race, creed, or disability. Most 4-H clubs have meetings for the entire membership once a month. During these meetings, decisions are made about group-sponsored activities such as community service efforts, project opportunities, and fund-raising efforts.

Regardless of the structure, a 4-H group may involve families, neighbors, relatives, and others. Participants have fun learning, working, and succeeding together in the home, neighborhood, and community.

Purpose of 4-H

The purpose of 4-H is two-fold:

- To provide real life experiences for youth through a fun, action-oriented, and practical program.
- To provide opportunity for parents and other interested adults to work with youth in their development.



Youth - General information:

- Youth must be affiliated with a club before they may sign-up for any projects. A list of all clubs is available from the Kenosha County UW-Extension office or on the web at www.kenoshacounty4h.org.
- Youth must meet the grade requirements outlined within this document in order to enroll in and participate in project activities and functions.
- **Grade level is determined by grade in school at time of 4-H enrollment.** Youth who are home-schooled should use declared grade. Youth are eligible for membership through the next year following high school graduation. If a youth drops out of school, they will be considered as if they had stayed in school and would complete their 4-H membership as the same time their grade cohort would complete their membership.
- For the safety of all Kenosha County 4-H members, ***youth must be enrolled in the project in order to participate in*** (physically engage or take part in) project functions. This excludes spectators.
- **All members will be assessed \$10.00 for membership, this includes \$1.00 for insurance. Horse project members are assessed \$11.00, this includes \$2.00 for insurance.** Fees are payable at the time of enrollment. Checks should be made out to "Kenosha County 4-H Council."
- Youth may add or delete projects until May 31st of the current 4-H year and still represent 4-H at the Kenosha County Fair if they meet all other requirements.
- ***The Kenosha County 4-H Member Code of Conduct*** is available on the web and on page 7 of this Guide. Please read it over carefully. When you sign the Enrollment Form, it will include your acceptance of the Code of Conduct. All Kenosha County 4-H members must abide by this code. For a copy, please visit the Kenosha County 4-H website at <http://www.kenoshacounty4h.org>.

Kenosha County 4-H offers all projects and activities listed in this guide members may enroll in. Please be aware that there are three levels of support for projects:

- 1. Countywide Level** -- a volunteer or group of volunteers (Educational Team) have come forward to teach that project to any 4-H members in Kenosha County who are enrolled. As of October 1, 2009, the following project areas have county- wide support:

- The list of countywide projects may change during the year. More may be added or removed at any time based on the availability of leaders.
 - Many of these projects also have leaders and meetings at the club level.
 - *Some of the countywide projects have dues requirements over-and-above regular 4-H county and club dues.*
- 2. Club Level** -- even if there isn't a countywide leader, there may be a volunteer who is willing to teach that project to members of their club who are enrolled.
 - Projects available at the club level vary widely between clubs and also may change at any time during the year based on the availability of leaders.
 - Please note that the UW-Extension office does *not* keep a list of which projects a particular club has leaders for. For questions regarding club leaders, please ask your General Leader.
 - 3. Independent or Individual Study Level** – No volunteers on the countywide or club levels have come forward to teach that project. In this case, the member is expected to learn on their own with the help of his/her family and appropriate resources such as 4-H literature, the library, or the internet.



Club - General Information:

- **All members will be assessed \$10.00 for membership, this includes \$1.00 for insurance. Horse project members are assessed \$11.00, this includes \$2.00 for insurance.** Fees are payable at the time of enrollment. Checks should be made out to "Kenosha County 4-H Council."
- **All enrollment forms must be signed by both the 4-H Member and their parent/guardian or they will not be accepted.**



Literature



1. *Several projects have new, fun and informative literature which will be helpful to all 4-Hers.* We encourage you to purchase literature that focuses on your project(s).
2. Every family will receive a copy of the 4-H Source Book. In that book is literature for some of the projects. You may order your literature direct from National 4-H Supply. Their website is: www.4hmall.org/4H_mall/home/.
3. The UW-Extension Office stocks a limited amount of literature. You may come to the office to purchase it directly.
4. Some of the UW-Extension publications for Food Preservation, Vegetables, and Flowers may be available on the Internet. Go to: <http://cecommerce.uwex.edu/>. If you can print them, there is no charge.
5. Project leaders will receive their materials free of charge.



Kenosha County 4-H Member Code of Conduct



The Kenosha County 4-H Council, Inc., has established the following **Code of Conduct** for Kenosha County 4-H members. Questions concerning these standards should be directed to the Kenosha County 4-H Council, Inc. The Board reserves the option to revise this **Code of Conduct** to better meet the needs of the Kenosha County 4-H Program. Additional member standards may apply to a particular 4-H project. Consult with a 4-H education team member in the particular project or the 4-H program staff for details.

The Code of Conduct States:

1. Members will conduct themselves with courteous manner and language, exhibiting good sportsmanship, serving as a positive role model, treating others with respect, and demonstrating reasonable conflict resolution skills.
2. Members will abide by all local, state and federal laws and UW-Extension and U.S.D.A. rules, policies and guidelines. Specifically, 4-H members in possession of or under the influence of alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, abuse of prescription or non-prescription drugs, or tobacco products while at a 4-H function, or while representing 4-H, will be suspended from 4-H for one year from the time of infraction.
3. Members will conduct themselves at 4-H events in a manner reflecting the positive ideals and goals reflected by the 4-H program.
4. Members will complete a 4-H record book representative of the member's 4-H work during the 4-H year and will turn the completed record book over to the club's leaders when requested at the end of the year.
5. Members will attend general club meetings and activities as often as possible and will inform the leaders prior to the meeting if attendance is not possible. Individual 4-H clubs may establish their own attendance requirements in the club's bylaws.
6. Members should only sign up for activities, projects and other obligations the member is capable of fulfilling. Allocation of the member's time and other resources should be made by the member in consultation with parents and 4-H leaders.
7. Members should attend all project meeting scheduled by project leaders in order to gain the maximum benefit from the 4-H project and inform project leaders when attendance is not possible.

Individual 4-H clubs may establish their own attendance and project completion requirements in the club's bylaws.

8. Competition is a part of almost every aspect of life. 4-H members are encouraged to keep competition in its proper perspective in relation to 4-H ideals and to compete with themselves to always make their personal best better.
9. Members agree to follow all rules and guidelines established by the local club, 4-H Council and project and activity teams where applicable.
10. Members are encouraged to make a public showing of their work in every project. This can be at the fair, mall expo, club meeting, demonstration contest or other event where people outside of your family or project group can view the results of your learning experience.

Suspension and Reinstatement of Membership:

Violation of the **Code of Conduct** may result in the suspension or termination of membership in the Kenosha County 4-H program. Suspended members may apply for reinstatement after one year.

Prior to re-instatement of membership, a member must:

- a. Present a signed statement of apology to the Kenosha County 4-H Council, Inc.
- b. Where applicable, attend an educational program concerning alcohol and/or drug abuse and present certification of completion of such to the 4-H Board of Directors. The program may include, but is not limited to: a) a certified drug addictions counselor, b) a peer mentor or c) an alcohol/drugs awareness class
- c. Reimburse the Kenosha County 4-H Council, Inc., the 4-H project and/or 4-H club for monies received towards award trips or other 4-H activities, if the infraction occurs before or during the event.

A second infraction of this **Code of Conduct** will result in permanent dismissal from the Kenosha County 4-H program.



Adult Volunteer General Information:

- ***Volunteer project leaders are always needed!*** If there is a project you would like to become involved with, or you see a need for a particular project area in the county or in your club, give the UW-Extension office a call or talk to your General Leader. No education or experience in that project is required, only a willingness to work with youth.
- If you have any questions or would like more information, please contact the Kenosha County UW-Extension office at 857-1945.
- All adults must complete 4-H Volunteer Orientation before they may begin working with youth.
- All adult 4-H volunteers must annually complete the 4-H Enrollment Form.

New for 2009-10. There are no levels within projects. For example, Dairy, not Dairy 1, 2 or 3.

Just a couple of reminders:

1. First and second graders enroll in only Cloverbuds.
2. Third graders enroll in Exploring and up to two (2) additional projects.
3. For fourth grade members, Exploring is optional and not required.
4. Members in the third grade *may* enroll in one animal project. Exceptions will be allowed with the approval of the General Club Leader and the UW-Extension Office.
5. Animal projects have age requirements. They also have specific project requirements which may be explained by the Education Team Chair.

Cloverbuds** (1st & 2nd Grade)

This educational program is for youth in first and second grade. Discover 4-H through experience in expressive arts, mechanical science, environmental education, personal growth, animal science, and many more. Cloverbuds are restricted from showing animals at 4-H shows including fairs, but may enter non-animal exhibits.

In order to represent Kenosha county 4-H at the Kenosha County Fair, all archery project members must be certified and shoot at least four rounds prior to the fair to determine an average.

In the 4-H Beef project, members will learn how to identify various beef breeds and parts of a beef animal, halter-break and show a calf; fit and judge beef cattle; recognize and raise a health animal.

Note: 4-H members must be in the 5th grade or higher to enroll in this project. In order to represent Kenosha County 4-H at any exhibitions in this project, members must attend three county-wide meetings.

Any requirements will be announced by Dairy Education Team.

Note: Members must be in the 4th grade to enroll in the project.

Learn how to select, feed, manage, fit, train, and show a dog. Note: Members must be at least in the 4th grade. There are specific requirements for numbers of meetings and an intensive training schedule starting in May. Additional fees will be required.

Beginners will learn how to tie fishing knots, cast a fishing lure, rig and care for your tackle, locate fish, identify baits and fish, and identify parts of the fish. Note: Member and a parent must attend 4 county-wide meetings/ events to be eligible for the casting contest at the Kenosha County Fair. There is a **\$5.00** participation fee per family paid to Educational Team by January 31st.

This project is open to 4-H members **who do not own, lease or manage a horse**. (Leasing and Managerial is the ability to have full use of a horse or pony. That is the horse project **NOT** Horseless Horse.)

Note: In order to represent Kenosha County 4-H at any exhibitions in this project, members must attend 5 of the 11 scheduled county-wide meetings/ events which start in September and must also attend required Horseless Horse Project Meetings as well in. An SEI approved helmet and hard-toes boots with a one-inch heel are required whenever riding. **Members must be enrolled by the January Countywide Meeting.**

So, you want a horse. Great! What breed, type, color and physical markings would you like. Are you ready for daily care like grooming, feeding, stable care, foot care and safety? Learn the right equipment and riding skills; all a part of the 4-H Horse/Pony Project. This project is open to 4-H members who own, lease or manage a horse or pony. (Leasing and managerial-access or use of another's animal is considered the Horse Project, not Horseless Horse.)

Note: In order to represent Kenosha County 4-H at any exhibitions in this project, members must be enrolled by the January countywide meeting and attend five of 11 county-wide meetings/ events which start in September. Members must also wear an SEI approved helmet. Hard-toed boots with a one-inch heel are required whenever riding.

Note: 4-H members must be in third grade or above and attend at least 5 of the 11 scheduled countywide meetings/ events which start in September in order to represent Kenosha County 4-H at the Kenosha County Fair.

Families in the Model Horse, Horse & Horseless Horse projects must obtain a \$30 sponsorship by January 31st, 2010. Each family is also required to fulfill a parent point.

Note: Members must attend two county-wide rabbit related events to represent Kenosha County 4-H at the Kenosha County Fair. Guinea Pigs & Cavies require one county-wide project meeting. Explorers may only show, not sell.

The Small Animal Education Team has additional guidelines regarding participation at the Small Animal Sale which are non-4-H events. For more information, contact the Small Animal Education Team.

Each family in the 4-H Sheep Project must provide a sponsor (dollar amount to be determined by Sheep Education Team) no later than the May lamb weigh-in. Members will be notified of any further requirements or changes.

Any project members may show breeding stock, only members fifth grade and up may show/sell market lambs.
