Over 780 residents representing nearly every local municipality in Kenosha County participated in the May 2, 2015 Kenosha County Collection Event. The event was a coordinated effort on the part of its sponsors; Kenosha County, Waste Management and Kenosha County UW-Extension. Volunteers from Wilmot H.S.
